
TEACHING NOTES: CHARLIE AND THE LOOSE TOOTH

SYNOPSIS


Charlie wakes up to discover his tooth is loose! But even the excitement of waiting for the tooth fairy can't get in the way of all the work to be done on the family farm.


ABOUT THE ILLUSTRATOR

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
EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY

Charlie and the Loose Tooth is a relatable story that gives children a glimpse at life on an Australian family farm.

DISCUSSION TOPICS

Read the book together, asking questions throughout.

- I. Look at the cover of the book together. What do you think the story might be about?
- 2. Charlie does a lot of chores on the farm. When you start reading the book, who or what do you think those chores might be? At the end of the book, what chores can you remember?
- 3. Do you have chores that you do at your house? What are they?
- 4. Have you or has somebody you know lost a tooth? What happened?
- 5. At the end of the book, Charlie decides to save his tooth fairy money for something special. What is Charlie saving for? What would you spend your tooth fairy money on?
- 6. What did the children think of the book? If they liked it, why did they like it? What was their favourite part?


